

Notes from the Council Meeting, 13th April 2016

Applications considered by the Planning Committee (see minutes for full details):

- **Land Adjacent 17 Glebelands.**Construction of 2 storey dwelling and off street parking. *Objection*
- **Bridlepath Lodge Woodhouse Hill.**Retention of mobile home for use as an annexe an use of former riding arena for use as motor vehicle storage (retrospective). *No Objection*
- **Pitt White Mill Lane.**Construction of conservatory to side elevation. *No Objection*
- **Spring House.**Two storey side extension. *No Objection*
- **Land East Of Redlane Cross Rocombe.**Erection of temporary agricultural workers' dwelling and poultry unit. *No final response made, waiting for response on updated information on the plan.*
- **Coombe Warren Gore Lane.**Engineering works to create new parking space in front garden. *No Objection*

Applications approved by EDDC / DCC:

- **The Lookout St Marys Lane.**Construction of replacement dwelling (revised design to 15/1773/FUL) and swimming pool. *Approved with numerous conditions*
- **Pitt White Mill Lane.**Construction of conservatory to side elevation. *Approved*
- **Spring House.**Two storey side extension. *Approved*

Footbridge: Uplyme has welcomed the new footbridge that has been installed over the river in the corner of King Georges field, the bridge was donated and installed by the Devon CC Flood Risk Management team as a further flood

prevention measure, since the old concrete structure was a significant obstacle to the free running of the river. In addition to this because the pathway is dangerous and slippery around this area it has been suggested to erect a handrail to improve safety.

Hunter's Lodge junction: A meeting between Councils, Highways and MP Neil Parish on 7th April got the long awaited approval to go ahead (albeit awaiting the final confirmation) on the A35 improvements with works starting in September 2016. Although this is good news for the A35, considering the time and effort spent, Uplyme Parish Council felt disappointed and let down as safety improvements were needed on the side roads, especially the approach to the junction from B3165 (Lyme Road) and will continue campaigning and pressing for this.
