Low hanging dangerous trees and branches - Lyme Road, Hunters Lodge to Uplyme:

Thanks to all who have responded but we are still asking residents and landowners to cut back overhanging trees and branches that are damaging vehicles (especially buses) and are hazardous to the public. The bus companies are threatening to close the service unless something is done. It is important that hedges and trees do not overhang the highway and it is the residents and/or landowner's responsibility to

prevent or remove any cause of danger, obstructions (including obstruction of a sign or light from a public lamp) or interference to users of the highway, which includes footpaths and roads. The Council would therefore advise that the residents should arrange for the overgrowth to be cut back immediately. If you are unable to do this, we may be able to arrange to have it done on your behalf, for a reasonable fee. Otherwise, Devon County Council will have to arrange the work and charge you accordingly. Please contact the Clerk or any Councillor if you know of any residents or landowner's with trees/branches hazardously overhanging Lyme Road.

## Devon Air Ambulance Night Landing Site – Uplyme King George V Fields:

Uplyme Parish Council is committed to progress this important emergency service project forward. ## **Uplyme Highways and Safety:**

The Uplyme Traffic Management Strategy team are actively meeting and discussing safety improvements within the village, one being especially around the area between Grogg Lane and Gore Lane where pedestrian safety and visibility are a problem. The Parish Council are seeking quotes to fell the two large trees at the bottom of the Millennium Copse and repair the wall. There is also the ongoing safety issue of the parking on double yellow lines at Cooks Mead roundabout. Councillor James is seeking advice and assessments from professional bodies to support the safety improvements.
